# about the PGF

The Post Graduate Foundation in Veterinary Science exists under the Senate of the University of Sydney. It is subject to a set of Rules pursuant to section 37 (1) of the university of Sydney Act 1989 (as amended) and Rule 5 (1) of the university of Sydney By Law 1999 (as amended).

The Post Graduate Foundation works as a centre for continuing veterinary education externally funded by its registered membership. It is thus, and has been for over 40 years, a major link between the veterinary profession and research-generated knowledge from the worlds most respected institutions.

As well, the Foundation through various means has supported numerous specific academic projects mostly within the Faculty of Veterinary Science at the University of Sydney.

The Foundation came about in 1965 due to the efforts of a diverse and forward thinking group of Australian veterinarians. It was recognised at that early stage that graduate veterinarians needed to have easy access to new knowledge as it became available through the endeavours of researchers and leading clinicians across all fields of veterinary science.

The Foundation is governed by a Council comprised of leaders in the world of business management, veterinary practice and academia.

# president's report

2006 has been a year of change for the PGF. Last May, at the AGM George Mack stepped down as President after 13 years at the helm, during which time he charted a safe course for the PGF through some potentially dangerous waters. George has remained on the Council, which has been greatly appreciated due to his wealth of experience and accumulated knowledge.

At the same meeting, Ken Smith retired from the Council, having been a member for 40 odd years and having been on the original Post Graduate Committee in Veterinary Science. Ken was the rudder for the PGF ship, keeping the Directors and the Council on course at all times with timely, probing questions and wise counsel when appropriate.

After 13 years with a non veterinarian as President, the members have returned to having a veterinarian and graduate of the University of Sydney as President. George Mack and Ken Smith both came from non veterinary backgrounds, which I believe has helped to keep the PGF anchored. The Council now mainly consists of veterinarians, for apart from George, Tony McGloin is now the only other non veterinarian and he has been associated with the profession for years through veterinary pharmaceutical manufacturing.

I believe that as a Council we have to be mindful of the need to avoid becoming insular and to try to look at the PGF through the eyes of our customers, our competitors and our staff.

2006 has also been a year of consolidation for the PGF. The Team has been ably led by the Director, Michele

Cotton, who has been very well assisted by Trish Swift, while Anna Jones is on maternity leave. I am sure that both of these people would agree that without the excellent staff who make up the rest of the PGF operational unit we would not have held our own during difficult times. Post Graduate continuing education is a rapidly changing business and to our credit the PGF has remained at the forefront through more effective marketing, utilisation of new technologies and delivery mechanisms, and modification of existing programmes while exploring innovative short courses. Everyone is aware that we cannot afford to rest on our laurels, as the supply of new educational products is increasing rapidly and the PGF needs to be responsive and flexible to accommodate new products and services as they are needed.

The University of Sydney has been undergoing a major restructuring program throughout most of 2006 in an aim to rationalise management and infrastructure in order to contain costs and to ensure the viability of the University. This has left the PGF in something of a void while it is decided where we should sit within the new university structure. The Council has been wrestling with new "Draft Rules" under which we are to operate while not knowing what the final reporting lines will be within the University. Thankfully, relations with the Faculty of Veterinary Science have continued to grow and develop so that it is hoped the PGF and Faculty will continue to work side by side without the PGF losing its independence, which has been so carefully defended and nurtured for over 40 years.



Financially the PGF has managed to return a small surplus for 2006. After months of frustration we now have our budgets and book-keeping aligned with the University and the new accrual system has survived a full year so that the “one off change” referred to last year by George Mack is behind us. Roula Kazzaz must be congratulated for her hard work and perseverance in meeting all the reporting requirements as she has had to satisfy the Council and the University Finance Department while introducing the new accounting and reporting procedures.

2007 should see further change, growth and development of the PGF as it moves to retain its old markets and develop new initiatives in an increasingly competitive global market. I encourage all members to support the PGF by increasing their annual donations and by utilising all of the wonderful tools offered by the PGF to satisfy CVE requirements and to increase their professional knowledge base. I also encourage everyone to contact the PGF Team to let them know how well they are doing or to suggest areas for improvement.

# director's report

## The Year 2006: Highlights and Overview

### Introduction

2006 Started out quite well with a fuller complement of trained and experienced staff to address the needs of our Membership. A project plan to upgrade our Database occupied our most significant Change Management task.

The University of Sydney has conducted extensive reviews on all its Foundations. A better understanding of what the PGF is and what it does is now acknowledged by University Administration, it was agreed that the PGF is not a "Foundation" which is a fundraiser as defined by the University, but more akin to a "Centre". It is recognised that we provide an increasingly important and long term link between the University, its Faculties and the worldwide Community.

This fits in well with the University's restructure that was announced in March 2006, since that date there has been ongoing discussion about where the PGF can be placed. It currently sits under the Senate.

As a result the University's perceived value of the PGF has changed slightly – we think for the altruistic better, and we look towards building up on this in the years to come.

We have also received a (University) recommendation that we change our name as soon as we can to reflect our true purpose. We are mindful of our Membership's fondness for the acronyms "PGC and PGF" and are

working towards retaining these in some form plus our familiar logo and the way our website works, all projects for the coming 12-24 months.

In 2006 the Courses Departments offered twenty-two courses in Eastern Australia and one in Hong Kong. As in previous years our course calendar included a range of hands-on workshops, five day major conferences, two day symposium and one day TimeOuts.

We again welcomed a cast of international speakers in 2006 that included Mark Glyde from Ireland, Jill Maddison, Andy Sparkes and Ian Ramsay from the United Kingdom, Ken Johnson, Dan Lewis, Howie Seims, Sherri Ross, Jeanne Barsanti, Craig Greene, Janet Foley, Rory Todhunter and Joerg Steiner from the United States of America and Jo Murrell from New Zealand.

We were delighted to welcome Kristin Taylor to our team as the Courses Administrative Assistant. Kristin has proved to be an invaluable asset to the Courses team. Unfortunately we will lose her temporarily in 2007 while she is on maternity leave but we eagerly await her return.

## Courses New Initiatives

We launched our stream of courses for Veterinary Nurses in 2006 and had 70 nurses attend our inaugural course in October, a figure that far exceeded our expectations. In 2007 we plan to run 6 courses that Veterinary Nurses can attend.

With venue and catering costs constantly increasing the Courses department has been trying to supplement their income to avoid huge increases in course prices. In 2006 they successfully did this by opening a number of their courses to trade exhibitors. In addition they are exploring new ways to increase the sponsorship opportunities at courses while still remaining within the PGF's policy of not allowing the educational content of any course to be sponsored. Some possible sponsorship opportunities being explored for 2007 include sponsoring social functions, an internet cafe, lanyards and conference bags.

In 2007 the Courses department is also planning to reduce their annual printing and mailing costs by substituting the mailings they currently sent for each individual course with a bi-monthly newsletter, the Goanna Gazette, which will contain details of all courses being held in a two month period.

## Working to achieve the PGF's Mission Statement

The Distance Education program is an essential part of the PGF's attempt to achieve the goal of "provide[ing] world class, unbiased, continuing veterinary education opportunities to meet the needs of our members". The program is unique both in Australia and indeed in the world in its combination of guided study, workshops continual feedback and online interaction. The deep learning that the program encourages will hopefully promote higher veterinary standards both in Australia and overseas.



In 2006 the program consisted of 15 courses and provided 25 workshops for a total of 217 participants. The participant breakdown across the different courses is provided below.

The department has continued to develop several new initiatives. An education review has been in progress through the year with one of Australia's leading educationalists Dr Julia Atkin. The aim of the review is to generate better educational outcomes, creating better DE courses and providing better education to our participating members, and by osmosis increasing the standards of the profession as a whole.

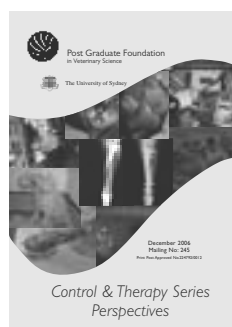
The year also saw the continued development of the new Feline Medicine course written by Drs Andy Sparkes and Carolyn O'Brien. The course will commence in 2007 with a limited intake of 20 participants. 2006 also saw the first attempt to increase interaction between the PGF and the Equine Veterinary Association in order to increase the market of the equine courses.

Development of the TimeOnline program has continued throughout 2006 in an initial market research and test phase. The TimeOnline program stands to be one of the more significant strategic directions for the PGF. The program is designed to deal with ongoing issues raised by the PGF membership with respect to accessibility, time to attend courses and the price of courses. The PGF membership was surveyed to find out the demand for the program and courses. 675 responses were returned to the PGF. The results of the survey indicate wide interest in many topics, both small and production/large animals, as well as wildlife and exotics.

2006 also saw the pilot TimeOnline course 'Arthritis' launched. The course ran with 51 participants. A staggering 99% of participants enjoyed the course and 100% of participants agreed that they would recommend the course to their colleagues. The success of the pilot is directly attributed to the incredible drive and effort of Dr Adam Toyer, who wrote and tutored the course and Ms Andrea Nolan, the PGF's Online Learning and Website coordinator, who developed the online format of the course. Special thanks also go to Dr Richard Malik who reviewed the material and Ms Giselle Alegria for her tireless and meticulous proofreading.

## Publications Report

Continuing to improve the C&T and Perspective series, the December 2006 issue appeared in an updated format i.e. produced together as a bound journal. This new presentation style is not only more



attractive but also more practical, as it keeps both issues together, provides a more durable copy able to be stored standing up in a bookshelf and eliminates the need for the traditional, green C&T binders (the cost of which, incidentally, proved prohibitive).

## Timing of Publications

Working on the 'less is more' principle, it was decided to produce our mailings on a quarterly basis each year. That way we hope to produce four mailings at least as large as our December C&T/Perspective issue, some 64 pages in total. That allows a decent interval for readers to digest the current issue and send in Replies and Comments. Over the last few years, it has been gratifying to see how interactive the series has become, evidenced by the increase in Replies from the odd one or two every now and then to the 10 1/2 pages in our December issue, complete with pictures.

On the subject of graphics and images, the response to our call to vets to supply these whenever possible has been overwhelming. The result has been a huge improvement in the quality of this publication, with the December issue featuring over 100 images including colour pictures, sketches, Xrays, diagrams, charts etc out of 64 pages.

The quality of the articles themselves continues to improve, which has been acknowledged by our membership and inspired non-members to join the PGF. In particular, the *Report on Leptospirosis between Cardwell and Babinda, Far North Queensland* by Dr Shane Tromp BVSc(Hons) ranks as one of the most interesting and original perspectives ever produced by the PGF.

Finally, the improvements mentioned above are self-perpetuating in that the more the publication improves, the more vets wish to be associated with it. Remembering how busy most vets in practice are, it is extremely rewarding to be associated with a unique publication such as the C&T/Perspective series which survives solely due to the voluntary (and unpaid) contributions of our readership.

We look forward to an even better 2007.


## Conclusion

# Valentine Charlton

## research report

The Valentine Charlton Bequest supports my part-time (0.4) position with the Foundation. The Bequest was intended to support all things pertaining to the health and well being of owned cats, through **active research** and the **dissemination of new clinical findings to the wider profession**.

In addition to this research role, I have a lot to do with a wide range of activities within the Foundation. Together with the courses team (Rhian, Suzanne and Kirsten), I set up the agenda, topics and speakers for major courses, symposia, workshops and the Time Out seminar series. This involves keeping up-to-date with “who is doing what” all around the world, and within Australia in multiple discipline areas of companion animal practice. Working with Lis, I edit (and contribute to) the Control and Therapy Series and The Perspectives, and actively solicit case material for these forums through my regular delivery of on-line advice. I have provided written and image resources to underpin the new feline distance education programme, and have reviewed material for this and other new PGF products such as Adam Toyer’s Time Online. I also contribute to strategic long term planning in relation to all facets of veterinary continuing education, provide an interface between the Foundation and the Australian College of Veterinary Scientists. I also provide a bridge to the Feline Advisory Bureau and the European Society of Feline Medicine and Surgery. Because I continue to be invited to speak nationally and internationally, I am in a good position to keep abreast in the latest trends in delivery of veterinary continuing education around the world.

*A great deal of new clinical and research information was published during 2006. Furthermore, a number of new research initiatives were undertaken.*

A large retrospective paper was published in the Australian Veterinary Journal which brought together 16 years of work concerning therapy of cats and dogs with cryptococcosis (O’Brien *et al* 2006). This paper represented the largest case series of companion animals (70 patients) with this disease to be published in the peer-reviewed literature, and compares favourably with many large human retrospective studies in its scope, and indeed in terms of the clinical outcomes for our small animal patients. The paper was written in collaboration with **Dr Carolyn O’Brien** (now working at the University of Melbourne) and other long term “cryptococcal colleagues”. The details of a very interesting single cat with a *C gattii* infection were published in a short but elegant paper in *Medical Mycology* (Kluger *et al* 2006); the isolate (a fertile VGIIB strain) was of particular interest as it has gone on to be used extensively in a variety of basic science studies, for example in relation to NMR imaging of cryptococcal lesions within the lungs or central nervous system (reviewed in Sorrel *et al* 2006).

A multi-institutional study of sarcoptic mange in the cat was published in the *Journal of Feline Medicine and Surgery* (Malik *et al* 2006). Contact with foxes or dogs were an important historical clue and, interestingly, affected cats were often not pruritic. Treatment with selamectin or ivermectin was curative. The largest case series of *Nocardia* species infections in cats was assembled and published in the *Australian Veterinary Journal*. This paper was written in collaboration with **Dr Mark Krockenberger**, Senior Lecturer in Veterinary Pathology. Detailed laboratory testing of isolates was found to be of great value, as *Nocardia nova* was found to be the most common cause of nocardiosis in Eastern Australia, and critically, this species is susceptible to amoxicillin as well as

other drugs such as trimethoprim sulpha and doxycycline. Immunosuppression, typically due to intercurrent disease (e.g. lymphoma), advanced FIV infection or corticosteroid therapy was found to be a predisposing feature in the vast majority of affected cats. The importance of cat fight injuries as a cause of *Nocardia* infections and infections due to other saprophytes normally living in soil prompted me to write a slightly unusual paper titled "Wound Cat" as a means of facilitating recognition of certain sites as being predisposed to these types of infection (Malik *et al* 2006). This paper and the "Wound cat" motif is being used extensively to assist in teaching undergraduate students the pathogenesis of a variety of infectious processes in the cat.

An Australia wide collaborative study identified a new familial disease of Abyssinian cats manifest as a preposition to the development of disseminated *Mycobacterium avium* infections (Baral *et al* 2006). A diffuse interstitial pattern in thoracic radiographs and failure of hair to grow after clipping were unusual but characteristic clinical features of this new entity, which is the subject of ongoing research. This collaboration hinged on the excellent work being done at Paddington Cat Hospital by **Drs Randolph Baral** and **Melissa Catt**.

One of the key research publications of the year was **Dr Joanna White's** seminal paper on the epidemiology of kidney disease in Australian cats. Joanna is doing a PhD under supervision of me, **Professor Paul Canfield** and **Dr Jacqueline Norris**, Senior Lecturer in Veterinary Microbiology at the University of Sydney. Joanna's paper carefully analysed over 180 cats with naturally-occurring renal disease, and demonstrated for the first time that there may be different subgroups, presumably with each having a different underlying disease pathomechanism. Unravelling these different constituent groups further will be of great importance in understanding the causes and hence prevention and therapy of renal insufficiency in Australian cats.

Joanna's studies are on-going, and currently she is working on a new clinical entity – a primary glomerulopathy of Abyssinian cats.

Work done in collaboration with **Dr Merran Govendir**, Senior Lecturer in Veterinary Pharmacology at the University of Sydney, have defined the role of doxycycline in the treatment of urinary tract infections of Australian cats (Wilson *et al* 2006). Although not as effective as amoxicillin clavulanate or the fluoroquinolones, the tetracyclines do have some efficacy against uropathogens of cats and dogs, and in some situations they may be the most convenient agents to use in this setting. An international collaborative study identified for the first time that "Candidatus mycoplasma turicensis" occurs in Australian cats, this being the third haemotropic mycoplasma to be identified within cats from Sydney (Willi *et al* 2006). This paper was published in the prestigious *Journal of Clinical Microbiology*. Another in Dr Jacqui Norris's series of papers on Corona virus infections appeared in the *Australian Veterinary Journal*, this one concerning the seroprevalence study of Feline Coronavirus in owned and feral cats in Sydney (Bell *et al* 2006); certain breed associations demonstrated previously by our group have been confirmed in this study, which points to the importance of the genetic predisposition to the development of FIP.

A pot pourri of clinical case studies were published in local Australian journals on a number of topics including invasive mammary carcinomas in dogs (Bosward *et al* 2006), oral canine papillomatosis (Rich *et al* 2006), re-entrant tachycardia in a Boxer dog (Foster *et al* 2006). These papers were helped by the involvement of clinicians from Double Bay veterinary Hospital – **Drs Dominic Barfield**, **Shannon Rich** and **Sally Pegrum**. Several other papers from my involvement of Double Bay veterinary hospital are in the pipeline, and the practice provides me with a "test bed" to, for example, test second hand suppliers of equipment suitable for small animal practice.

Finally, I contributed to a three-day program organised by the European Society of Feline Medicine and Surgery in Rome as a key note speaker with Dr Kenny Simpson from Cornell University and spoke and chaired sessions at Science Week of the Australian College of Veterinary Scientists.

Importantly, several new initiatives were started in 2006.

1. In collaboration with **Drs Joanna White, Jacqueline Norris and Jenny Ann Toribio** we have undertaken an epidemiologically rigorous census of cats in the Sydney region. The results from this undertaking, funded by the PGF, are currently being analysed and should underpin a great deal of future research concerning disease conditions in Australian acts by defining properly a normal reference population.
2. Studies of the global epidemiology of cryptococcosis especially in relation to *C. gattii* infections are being undertaken by Nathan Saul, who is being supervised by **Drs Dee Carter, Mark Krockenberger** and I. Our collaboration with **Associate Professor Wieland Meyer** and **Professor Tania Sorrel** at Westmead Hospital are critical to this work.
3. Studies of infectious diseases of koalas are being conducted with great care by PhD student Joanna Griffith and postdoctoral fellow **Dr Damien Higgins**, with important input from **Professor Paul Canfield, Dr Merran Govendir** and **Dr Susan Hemsley**. Collaborative studies with **Dr Janet Fyfe** of the Victorian Reference Laboratory in Mycobacteriology have uncovered a new species of mycobacteria affecting cats in a geographically distinct region of rural Victoria.
4. Virulence studies of *C. gattii* in a rat model are being completed in collaboration with colleagues at Westmead Hospital, **Professor Paul Canfield** and **Dr Mark Krockenberger**.
5. Studies on resistance of canine and feline bacterial isolates to various antibiotics were undertaken in collaboration with BSc (vet) student Susan Gottlieb and **Dr Merran Govendir**.

6. I have started visiting the RSPCA at Yagoona on a regular basis to assist in the management of difficult medical cases, and the mentoring of their great team of enthusiastic young veterinarians. This should also provide a wealth of material for Control and Therapy and a terrific range of clinical images.
7. I have continued to work with a selection of compounding pharmacists to provide colleagues in practice with difficult to get and/or expensive drugs such as trilostane and fluconazole.

# TG Hungerford

## award for 2006

The Hungerford Award is the highest honour the Post Graduate Foundation can bestow onto a veterinarian in Australia. It rewards a sustained contribution to continuing education in a given discipline of Veterinary Science. For 2006, it is our pleasure to give this honour to **Drs Glenn Edwards** and **Wing Tip Wong** for their combined contributions to veterinary continuing education in the area of Small Animal Surgery.

Since 1996, Wing Tip and Glenn have together put together a contemporary and engaging program in small animal surgery, incorporating both orthopaedics and soft tissue surgery. Glenn contributed principally to the small animal component, while Wing Tip was largely responsible for orthopaedics and neurosurgery. The program has evolved over the last 10 years, with constant annual improvements and two major rewrites, to keep the material fresh, pertinent and up-to-date. The modules are well written, comprehensively referenced and presented in a thoughtful manner. Both Glenn and Wing Tip have been forward thinking in their use of visual material to enhance the quality of their written material, while Wing Tip has produced a very useful video describing the approach to different anatomical regions in relation to surgery of fractures. More recently, short movie clips to illustrate numerous pertinent procedures have been incorporated in to the course material. A highlight of the program in soft tissue surgery is the two hand-on workshops in surgery, which has taken advantage of the outstanding facilities at Werribee, one of the few Universities in Australia that still permits cadaveric surgery.

Based on our impression at the Foundation, and the exit surveys of participants in the soft tissue surgery program, there is no doubt that the course Wing Tip and Glenn have crafted together is absolutely first rate.

They have also made important contributions to a number of other activities of the Foundation over the years, including major refresher courses, workshops and symposia.

*Having worked with Wing Tip and Glenn during their many years of presenting their Distance Education Program, the DE team have found them to be great to work with. They are very positive in their dealings with staff and participants alike, always showing an interest in individuals and making that extra effort to put you at ease. They are very helpful, quite often taking on more than is required of them to achieve the ultimate goal of presenting their course in the best way they can. This is especially demonstrated in the way they have embraced the advent of new technologies and incorporated them in their course, all with the aim of reaching as many veterinarians as possible in a variety of mediums. It is obvious that they love what they do and this serves to really engage the learner. They put in a constant effort each month of every year to keep their material up to date and to provide ongoing valuable feedback to their participants. They both generously give a part of themselves to make their course work as well as it does and they really deserve this recognition for their achievements.*

In addition to the Distance Education programs they have run for the Foundation, both Glenn and Wing Tip have contributed broadly to veterinary education regionally, nationally and internationally. It goes without saying that Drs Edwards and Wong have been outstanding and inspirational teachers to undergraduates in the veterinary science program at the University of Melbourne. In addition, they both, at different times, have made important contributions to the management of cases within the hospital, and

indeed with the overall provision of a surgery service to the clinic at Werribee. Furthermore, both have taken turns as Superintendent of the Veterinary Hospital and Clinic of the University of Melbourne. They have both spoken at innumerable metropolitan practitioners' meetings in Melbourne, at meetings of the Australian Veterinary Association and Science Week of the Australian College of Veterinary Scientists. Both Glenn and Wing Tip have been active in the Australian College of Veterinary Scientists, both being mentors and examiners at the membership level over the years.

Wing Tip has over 30 publications – covering a broad range of mainly surgical topics pertaining to cats and dogs. Amongst these papers, which cover a huge territory of both soft tissue and orthopedic surgery, are a smattering of other medicine papers, covering topics as disparate as FIP and sporotrichosis in the cat, semen quality in the dog, new parasitic disease of cats, and the population dynamic of purebred dogs in Malaysia. The key surgery publications concern fracture management, partial anterior cruciate injury in the dog, causes and treatment of osteomyelitis, the use of pulsed ultrasound to improve fracture healing, denervation as a treatment for hip dysplasia/arthritis and feline bilateral olecranon avulsion. Most recently, Wing Tip has been proactive in the provision of veterinary continuing education to south East Asia, making important contributions to delivery of post graduate courses in Malaysia, Thailand and Hong Kong.

Glenn has a diverse range of clinical publications, including authoritative case series on a variety of conditions including urinary incontinence, laryngeal paralysis, congenital cardiac disease and perianal fistulae. In addition, he had over 40 research publications concerned with all manner of biomaterials in a variety of animal model systems. His contribution to the development of an external cardiac assistance device suitable for long-term treatment of people and animals with congestive heart failure is especially impressive.

Taken together, Drs Edwards and Wong have made an important contribution to veterinary continuing education. They are inspirational teachers, who demonstrate the value of research led teaching. They have managed to cultivate the enthusiasm and love they have for the discipline of surgery, and generously share their knowledge and enthusiasm with successive waves of veterinarians in practice. They are thus both worthy recipients of the Hungerford Award for 2006. It is also pertinent to make special mention of **Carol Bradley**, the Head Nurse at the Veterinary Teaching Hospital at Werribee, who has through hard work and extraordinary efficiency made a huge contribution to the smooth running of all the workshops and symposia the PGF have run in association with Wing Tip and Glenn and their programs over the last 10 years.

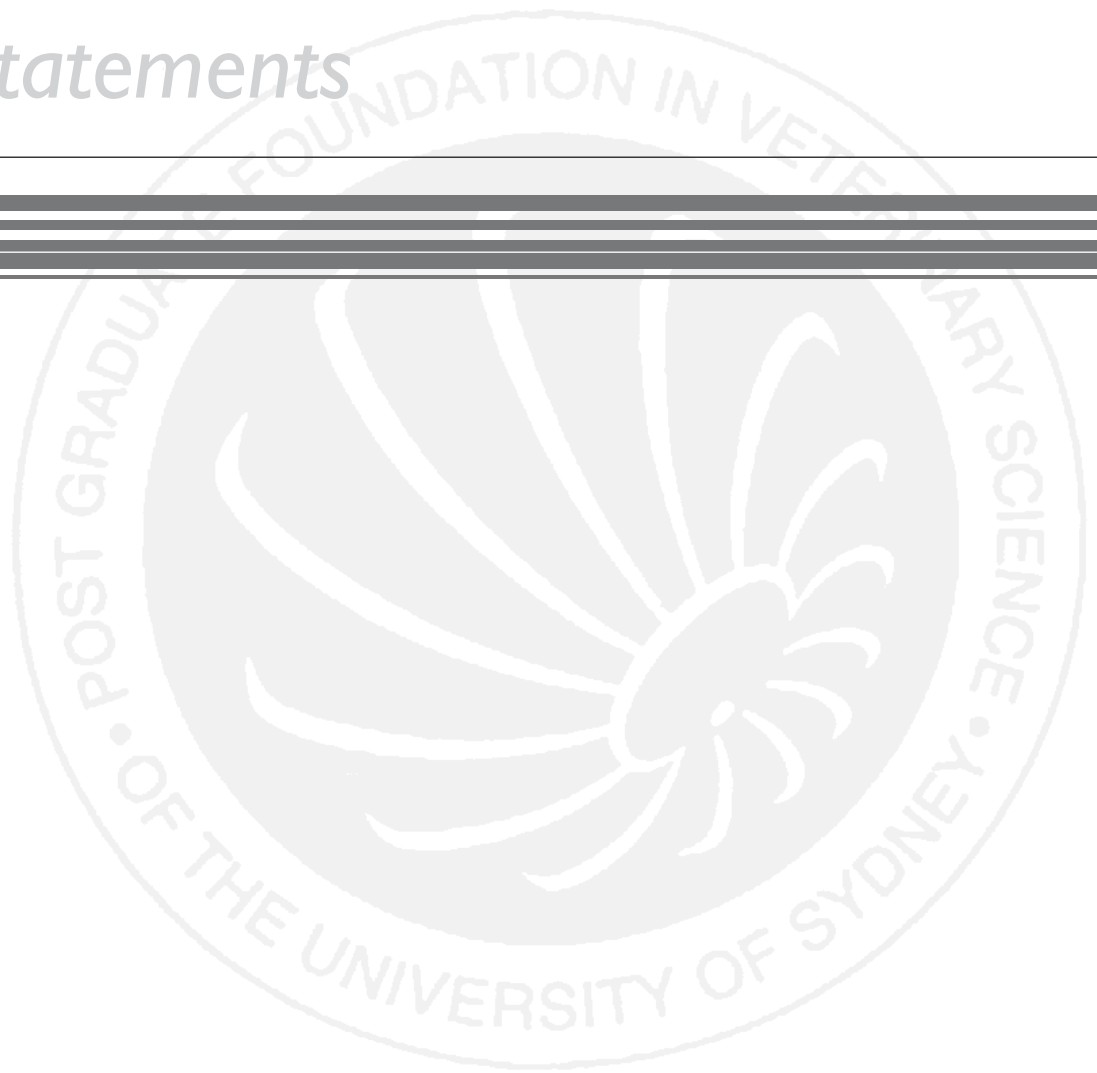

*The Hunter Valley property Ellerston was originally purchased in 1972 by Sir Frank Packer and James Dunlop MacLeod. His name is remembered today in many ways:*

*There is a polo cup in JD MacLeod's name and also a JD MacLeod perpetual trophy awarded annually for equine hacking events at the Sydney Royal Easter Show. JD MacLeod was a prominent figure in the horse world.*

*He died in late 1973 and the university was first made aware of his will in Jan 1974.*

*He left the sum of \$35,000 to his neice and on her death the remainder was to go to the PGF.*

*In 1994, after the death of JD MacLeod's neice, the PGF received the sum of \$35,000.*

The Financial Statements have been prepared on a modified accrual basis of accounting and therefore prepaid expense has been treated as an asset.


## 3 Student Fees
