Local anaesthesia has evolved in the last few years to become a very precise tool. The technology available today allow us to desensitise with great accuracy any part nerve or part of the body.

This workshop targets people with some experience in local anaesthesia who want to improve their knowledge and expertise. We will use readily available equipment (eg. ultrasonography, spinal needles, etc) to master very useful local anaesthetic techniques that general practitioners will be able to implement from day one.

- ✓ Identify useful blocks for specific body areas.
- ✓ Master identification of some nerve structures and ultrasonographic landmarks: sciatic, femoral nerves, transabdominalis muscle plane block, etc.

9.00 Ultrasound in veterinary Anaesthesia: principles and equipment

Practical session using turkey/chicken breast to gain dexterity in the eye-hand coordination. Participants will engage in prepared tasks with healthy competition.

12.00 Interfascial blocks (transversus abdominalis muscle -TAP- block and Serratus muscle plane block) and intercostal block.

Identification of key anatomical structures via ultrasounds and practicing injecting either saline or dye. Attendees will be able to dissect the cadavers to assess their success.

2.00 Blocks for the forelimb (Brachial plexus and RUMM blocks)

Identification of key anatomical structures via ultrasounds and practicing injecting either saline or dye. Attendees will be able to dissect the cadavers to assess their success.

3.30 Blocks for the hindlimb (Sciatic and femoral/saphenous nerves blocks)

Identification of key anatomical structures via ultrasounds and practicing injecting either saline or dye. Attendees will be able to dissect the cadavers to assess their success.

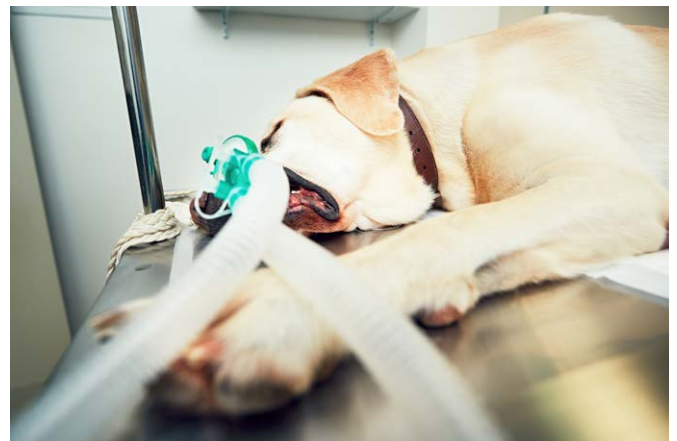
Fernando Martinez-Taboada
